## Things We Do

**Sunday:** *As Most Church's do, we have several things happening Sundays*

- First, we have coffee and fellowship from about 9:00-On
- Morning Worship starts at 10:30 and typically wraps up about 11:30
- One Sunday a quarter is our All Church Leadership/Vision Meeting.

**Monday:** *is the Church's Administration day.*

**Wednesday:** *Like most churches, there always things going on Wednesdays.*

- Youth group is our main event every Wednesday night 6-8:30pm in the New Youth room!
- We do a prayer night on the First Wednesday of Every Month.
- We also have Ministry Nights Once a Month.

**Thursday:** *Is an evening for meeting and ministry.*

- Is our young adult night. Our college age and young married couples get together on Thursdays at 6:00.

**Friday and Saturday:** *Are typically reserved for special events.*

Doing things that don't make sense to us seems to be a hallmark of Christ's earthly behavior. Almost the entirety of the Sermon on the mount was a lesson in how to behave oppositely from what our basic human nature desires. And as Jesus progresses in teaching it doesn't get any easier for those who are listening.

But what about some of the things He actually does?

Yeah those are strange and difficult too.

Take this mud instance for example. Here is this guy born blind. Not to crazy it happens. In fact he had been blind from birth and a good reading of the text suggests that he was actually born without formed eyes. So he wasn't simply blind ... he had no eyes. And this guy bumps into Jesus and the disciples, whom immediately assumed that someone must have sinned to have caused such a lowly state to befall this man.

And Jesus answers in a way that rubs a lot of people the wrong way. He says that God caused this blindness in the man. There was no sin involved in his life or that of his parents, but he was born this way so that the Glory of God could be displayed now.

Say what? God intentionally caused an affliction in a person, simply so that He could cure it later? Yes. Even if you want to play the "Well God allowed it card ... it is still His fault. But why?

Most didn't realize it at the time but I believe Jesus was making a statement. Genesis tells us that from the mud of the earth we were formed. And here Jesus makes mud once again to put into the eyes of a man who was formed incomplete. Jesus is finishing the job in a way that only God can. He was here, allowing someone's weakness to prove his strength. To prove that He is God. So what is he proving in your life?
