Q: What kind of programs do you run for kids and families?



Things We Do

Sunday: As Most Church's do, we have several things happening Sundays

- First, we have coffee and fellowship from about 9:00-On

I want us to look at a type of person that every church has. The faithful servants who do so many things out of a love for what God is doing and a love for those they consider their family in Christ. They are not often noticed, rarely rewarded, and even less are they thanked. But that's ok with them, they do not do what they do for the earthly accolades of other people. They do it because they learned the most important of commandments far better than the rest of us.

The Bible is overflowing with Characters like these. And while so many people strive to be and enjoy the spotlight of being a David or a Moses or a Paul... the Jonathans, the Stephens, the Siluses, the Ruth's, the Tituses, the Aarons, and all the others who came alongside the leaders and heroes of our faith to help them succeed.

Jesus had many of these people around Him and it should come as no surprise that many of them were women. It is really only recently in human culture that women have earned even a semblance of equality. There have been moments, sure, but typically they were few and far between. Men have always dominated the landscape of culture, and Jesus' time was no different... Only He was different. He did things for many marginalized people that flew in the face of both the Roman and Hebrew culture.

He gathered people that others ignored. He gathered the women, he gathered the young, he gathered the outcasts, and he gathered the sinful, and Jesus treated them equally. He didn't just make them noticed. He made them matter. And many of these people in response, knowing how culture quietly accepted the Lord's attention and both served and sat at the Lord's feet, treated as not simply followers but friends and loved ones.

People like these still inhabit our churches today, loving and serving the Lord in ways that many others could not. They are some of our greatest examples of faithfulness. And we couldn't do it without them. March 10, 2019
