*Q: Are the pastor's available for questions and counseling?*

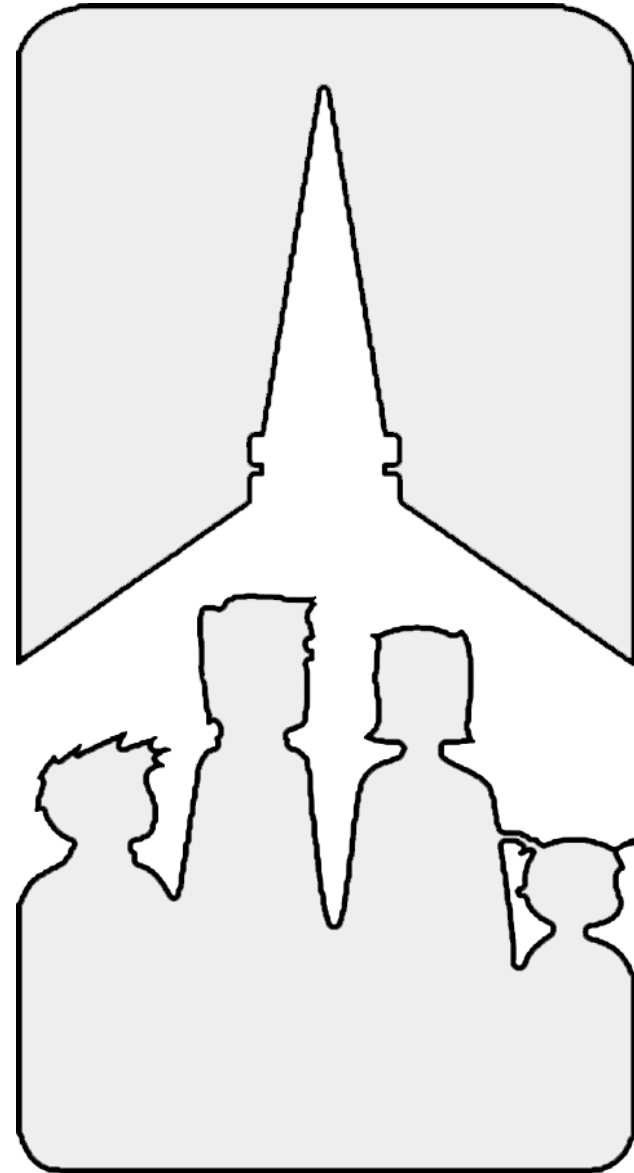

There probably isn't a person alive who hasn't been hurt by someone close to them. I'm pretty sure we've all suffered through the pain of betrayal in one form or another. Most of the time it is simply a matter of thoughtless selfishness committed by another person. A moment where they "Didn't think" before they did whatever thing they did. Some small gossip that ended up getting out of control. Perhaps it was saying something rude or bringing up an embarrassing moment that they find amusing. A white lie intended to keep a matter hidden instead of causing hurt. Or misunderstanding of motives. These are all pretty common examples of ways we hurt one another.

But what about when it is something more? Something that really matters? Something that can't just be waved away or soothed with a sincere apology? What about when what happened hurts us deeply? Hurts the ones we love? Destroys our trust? What about when a child rages against the love of their parents? A spouse cheats on the other? A close friend steals? You discover a web of lies and bitterness aimed at you by one you trusted? What then?

The sins of Pride, Ignorance, and Selfishness are as common to the human condition as breathing. They are things that "good" people strive to eliminate from their lives. They are the core concepts that causes us to sin, making their elimination the center and base of Christ like behavioral practice. Failure to manage these three issues is also almost always the cause of betrayal.

Judas was likely deep in all three when he agreed to betray his Lord. But Jesus treats Judas as a loved and honored friend all the way to the very end of their relationship. Even though he knows that Judas will ultimately betray him, Jesus still loves. And it is a easy guess to say that Jesus would have continued to love had Judas come back asking for forgiveness. We've all been betrayed. On the surface and deep where it hurts badly. None escape life without feeling it. But how do we handle that? In anger or with love, love like Christ?
